## Community Survey Regarding Myers/Harter Sanctuary

In our 2023 Summer edition of the SCOPE, we notified the community of the W&SD's consideration of having the SLA lease the Myers/Harter Sanctuary (park) and having the community help raise money for the maintenance of the park. The park maintenance costs were not in the W&SD budget as part of the sewer installation loan agreement. We would like the community to provide answers to the following questions so we have a good understanding of how important the park is to the community:

- How many times a year do you go to the park, other than the SLA Annual Picnic?
- When you go to the park, how do you use the park? For example, for walks, conversation with friends, or use of the space for athletic endeavors (e.g., the volleyball court).
- Would you like to see improvements to the park and if so, of what nature?
- If the maintenance of the park becomes a community cost, what are you willing to pay on an annual basis?
- Would you volunteer to help maintain the park (never, 2 times a year, on a semi-regular basis such as locking/unlocking the gate daily during the open season – possibly on a rotating schedule with others)?

You either have or will soon receive an email so you can more easily reply to this query.

The SLA has multiple goals in our By-laws; one goal in particular drives our cleanup efforts: "Advocate for safe, sustainable, and clean use of the lake and surrounding ecosystems and their public access avenues." Did you ever consider what this goal really means?



## **Photo Calendar Contest**

## PERIL ON THE LAKE By Susanna Fries

"On a hot summer day, there's nothing more refreshing or satisfying than skimming across the waters of Sacheen Lake in your motor boat. The wind in your hair. The sun beating down on you. The hum of the motor... until it stops, in the middle of the lake and your husband says with a chuckle, "Ooops. Out of gas."

As he sits in the captain's chair calmly, my mind starts to race. Our daughter, barely a toddler at the time, is on the boat, along with my husband's cousin and his wife. I go into a 'panic, we must solve this problem now mode'. Like a sailor scouting for icebergs on the Titanic, I look to see how far we are from shore. Ah, ¼ mile. I estimate how far a hike, once I get to shore, it is back to our cabin where I can grab the gas can. Ah, perhaps one mile. I realize I'm in my bare feet, but having run the road many times, I know it won't be too hard on them. Once I grab the gas can, I can also grab my shoes from the cabin, hike back to where our boat is, and by that time, perhaps the crew on board will have rowed to shore. In a matter of seconds, I have come up with this BRILLIANT plan, and loudly proclaim the obvious and logical solution to our problem: I CAN SWIM!

Everyone looks at me and laughs. I say it again, "No, really, I can swim! I was a great swimmer in high school and I can swim to shore and get the gas." My plan is no longer met with laughter, but with silence and a puzzled look from everyone, as if it is the craziest idea they've ever heard. I am shocked. Here we are, in the middle of the lake, stranded. With a toddler. In the heat. We have no food. We have no water, except that which surrounds us. Who knows how long we can survive!

Suddenly, out of the blue, two boats come racing towards us, and both, with friendly folk on board pull up and say, "Hey, ya' outta gas?!" "Do you need a tow?" My husband looks at me and laughs, "Yes!". And just like that, we're handed a rope and the Good Samaritans on the lake tow us back to the cabin.

Since that 'life-threatening' day, whenever we are in dire straits, my husband tells people, "Don't worry, she can swim." And he gently, then lovingly reminds me that on Sacheen Lake, if you run out of gas, you just sit there, quietly, in your boat and in minutes someone will pull up alongside you and ask if you're out of gas and need help. Yes, it's that kind of lake. No swimming necessary. Your neighbors (even the ones you don't know) are happy to help out.

WARNING: do not try this on any other lake"

## **Cougar Sightings**

This fall we have had reports of frequent cougar sightings. In past editions of the SCOPE, we included information about the dangers of cougars, how to avoid them, what to do when confronted by one, and more. - How can I recreate safely in cougar country?

- What do I do if a cougar attacks?

## "What do I do if I encounter a cougar?

- Don't run! Running will provoke the predatory chasing behavior of cougars, as it would with other predators such as bears, coyotes and wolves.
- Pick up small children or pets that are with you.
- Directly face the cougar, but look at the cougar's feet, not directly into their eyes, to avoid appearing aggressive.
- If the cougar displays aggressive behavior try to appear larger—raise your arms or open your jacket over your head.
- Make noise by yelling, blowing a whistle or an air horn.
- If you have an umbrella, quickly open and close it while facing the cougar.
- Do not approach the cougar. Give it ample space to run away—don't corner it.
- If there are cubs, be careful not to get between them and their mother."



## **Boat Fuel Tax Refund**

Like to cruise in your boat, take the kids/grandkids for a tow, waterski the lake, or fish? We know gas prices have gone up, down, up, and ... continue to increase in price with the rest of life's expenses. The SLA has been made aware, via an article in the Deer Lake Property Owner's Association newsletter, that it is possible to get a tax refund for boat fuel. South Pend Oreille Fire and Rescue (SPOFR) has a webpage for community education. In particular, they have information on CPR classes, outdoor burning, and fire education videos, some of which specifically address defensible space around your home. The meetings are open to the public." And they list the date of the next meeting (in case we forget). They also have multiple locations on their website pointing to Nixle. Per their website, Nixle provides "... Wildfire updates through Nixle, the new Community Information Service designed to deliver important and timely information to residents in our county using the latest technology. Get trustworthy and important neighborhood-level public safety and community event notifications instantly sent to you by cell phone text message, email, and the web." ## **DNR Harvesting Information**

DNR has affirmed there is no change to the general timeline as illustrated below:

- "Auction date for timber harvest (Harvest may begin in the spring): 1/23/2024
- Contract end date for timber harvest, harvest completion: 10/26/2025
- Prescribed fire burning of mechanical slash piles: Fall 2025 and/or fall 2026
- Weed and vegetation control: Summer/fall 2026
- Planting by hand crews: Spring 2027

\*Dates are subject to change, due to extensions, weather, ground conditions, among various other factors."

We may see increased activity on the south side of Sacheen Lake as early as this spring, so if you drive on Sacheen Southshore Rd. 


## Other Calendar Photo Contest Entries
