

## Notes:

If park use was the picnic or clean up of the park, it was assumed the answer to 1 was 0 and 2 was $\mathrm{N} / \mathrm{A}$.
If no specific input was provided, "no answer" was the input
Some input was written prose so there was interpretation of answers if sufficient information was given. Like, "we play volleyball at the park with the family" was used to imply that An "unknown" response was for non-definitive responses, such as they might give some money for maintenance per year, but they didn't know how much.
"Maybe" answers for park maintenance were accepted as input. Typically, if an answer could be inferred instead, it was. Otherwise specific numbers of support times was used or The counts (number of) above are based on the responses, not how many people a response represents.
