Boundary Dam	Camp (Crawford State Park), Garner Cave, part of 70 mile waterway
Browns Lake	Fly fishing only, camping, walking, kayaking
Horseshoe Lake	Kayaking, fishing
Kettle Falls Campground (National Park)	Columbia River boating, Trout Lake fishing and kayaking (30 min west on 20)
Little Spokane River	River float (kayak, pontoon boat), fish
Mt Spokane	Hikes, views, picnic, camp
Priest Lake	Boating, camping/resort, lake front restaurants, fishing
Priest Lake State Park Lionhead	Camping, water sports, fish upper Priest Lake for trout
Riverside State Park	Camp, fish (including guided), kayak /white water (rough water)
Sandpoint, ID	Sight seeing, restaurants, music, local hills hiking
Yocum Lake	Westslope cutthroat fishing

Lake Leo (by lone)	Rainbow, Tiger Trout
Little Spokane River	Trout, white fish
Marshall Lake	Cutthroat, bass
No Name Lake	Cutthroat (hike into lake 1/4 mile)
Petit Lake	Cutthroat
Priest Lake	Trout fishing in upper lake. Main body for deep fishing (kokanee)
Priest River	Cutthroat, Brook trout
Sacheen Lake	Trout, bass, crappie, yellow perch
Spokane River / Long Lake	Trout (including guided)
Sullivan Lake	Rainbow, Brown, Tiger, kokanee
Yocum Lake	Westslope cutthroat
